Falls Fest:

Parks & Recreation hosted the 3rd Annual Tumwater Falls Fest on Saturday, September 28, in Brewery Park at Tumwater Falls. Facilities Division Highlights

As they do every month, Facilities worked on a wide variety of projects to maintain all of our City buildings. Facilities staff has been working to install two new HVAC units at the Brewmaster's House (formerly Henderson House). Work is also underway to repair the foundation at Crosby House. And (much to upstairs staff's relief) Facilities staff bravely captured a mischievous squirrel in the attic of City Hall!

Parks Division Highlights

In early September, Parks staff completed aerification of the Pioneer Park sports fields. This includes removing plugs, filling with sand, and dragging the sand for uniformity. This annual process supports the turf health in numerous ways, resulting in improved soils that over time will need less water and nutrients. This very involved process is important for our community as well, because field use becomes steadily heavier as spring approaches.

Staff installed new irrigation at Deschutes Valley Park with a Rain Master Central Control. This system is a "real time" control that maximizes irrigation efficiency and water savings. Plans are in the works to have this great tool in several more Tumwater parks.

Tis the season for high school cross country competitions. Both Tumwater &Black Hills compete at Pioneer Park on a specified route through the trails. Staff performs extra maintenance on those routes for the volume of runners. It's quite fun thing to watch. Come support your local high school athletes!

Golf Highlights - First Green Event

On September 26, Tumwater Valley Golf Course hosted Bush Middle School 8th grade Advanced Environmental Science students (approx. 60) for a First Green Event.

First Green is a science, technology, engineering, arts and math (STEAM) environmental outreach program that uses the golf course as a living laboratory. K-12 students participate in hands-on, outdoor learning stations that include lessons on wildlife habitat, soil science, environmental sustainability, mathematics, water conservation, water quality, and much more.
